



The initial building work in the six-phase development of the new town of Dalgety, the £15 million dormitory town which is to be built entirely by private enterprise on a 100-acre site overlooking Dalgety Bay, near Aberdeen, will begin in the spring of next year.

The largest private enterprise of this nature in Scotland has complete and detailed plans for the project now in hand.

The plans were announced on Tuesday at a Press conference held at the offices of the development company, Couthall & Partners (Dalgety) Developments Ltd.


